Monterey County Elections STUDENT PROGRAM

What is the Monterey County Elections Student Program?

Legislation¹ in California allows eligible students to serve as poll worker. Participating students will serve in the operation of a poll site on Election Day or inspect vote-by-mail ballots on one of two Saturdays prior to the election².

Eligible students will be nominated by a teacher, at least 16 years of age at the time of the election, with at least a 2.5 GPA, and a United States Citizen or lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States. All volunteers must complete a form prior to training that requests their Social Security Number, residential address, mailing address, and an earnings statement.

Educators:

- ✓ Inform your students of this unique opportunity to be involved with their government.
- ✓ Nominate qualified eligible students to serve as poll workers.
- ✓ Follow up with your students about their Election Day experience.

Students:

- ✓ Participate in a 2.5-hour training class before the election.
- ✓ Be a member of a 4-6-person team and participate in the operation of a polling place on Election Day.

Note: Election Day can be a long one, 6:00 a.m. – 9:30 p.m., but it is a great experience!

Ballot inspectors will serve on one of two Saturdays prior to the election extracting and inspecting vote by mail ballots. Same-day training is provided. Ballot inspectors serve for credit only.

Benefits:

- ✓ This opportunity will give students a "hands-on" experience, learning how local elections work.
- ✓ Students will receive training on how to open a polling place, process voters, and close the polls.
- ✓ It will inspire students to pre-register and to vote when they turn 18.
- ✓ Students gain a lifelong appreciation for the democratic process.
- ✓ Students play an active and important role in their community.
- ✓ Student poll workers may choose to receive community service credit or a stipend of \$110, in addition to a \$25 stipend for attending training.
